The 'Comfy' Shawl

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I have crocheted the shawl with Durable Cosy (50% wool and 50% acryl) , Durable Cosy is a yarn for hook needle 5-7mm.

Use 5 balls for a shawl of about 165 -175 cm (point to point), then he is long enough to hit him once around your neck. For children, this is also a perfect size.

Use 7 balls for a long long XL shawl of about 250-260 cm (point to point). Then he's long enough to hit him twice around your neck.

- Hook needle 6mm
- Stop needle
- Scissors

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dc = double crochet

ch = chain

FP dc= front post double crochet

BPdc = back post double crochet

Turn your work after each row.

The 3 chain's count as 1 double crochet.

We increase and decrease at the beginning and the end of the shawl on one side.

Crocheting the shawl loosely.

Crochet you tight? Use a hook needle bigger, take a 6.5mm or 7mm. If you use a bigger needle, you may use also more yarn. Keep that in mind.



Follow the pattern or/and the crochet diagram. Good luck!

Start with a magic ring/loop

When you crochet the shawl with 5 balls

Repeat Row 21 & 22

After that we will decrease the scarf again on one side. Go now to Row 126 . Do not forget to read the information at *

When you crochet the shawl with 7 balls

Fck`&`lc`%&`)

Repeat Row 21 & 22

* Now we gone decrease. We decrease on one side of your shawl. Just like at the beginning of you're shawl. Resulting: crocheting in to the point.
Please note that you decrease on the same side as you've increase at the beginning. This way you get the points equal on both sides of you're shawl.

You'll start off a row at the front of your shawl.

You're shawl is ready, bind off!

Optional:

Put the tassels at the bottom of your shawl.

Cut threads of 30 cm long. Cut per tassel about 15 threads. Fold the threads double and make a loop at the top. Tie a piece yarn under the loop. Then sew the tassels with a lint at the bottom of your scarf.

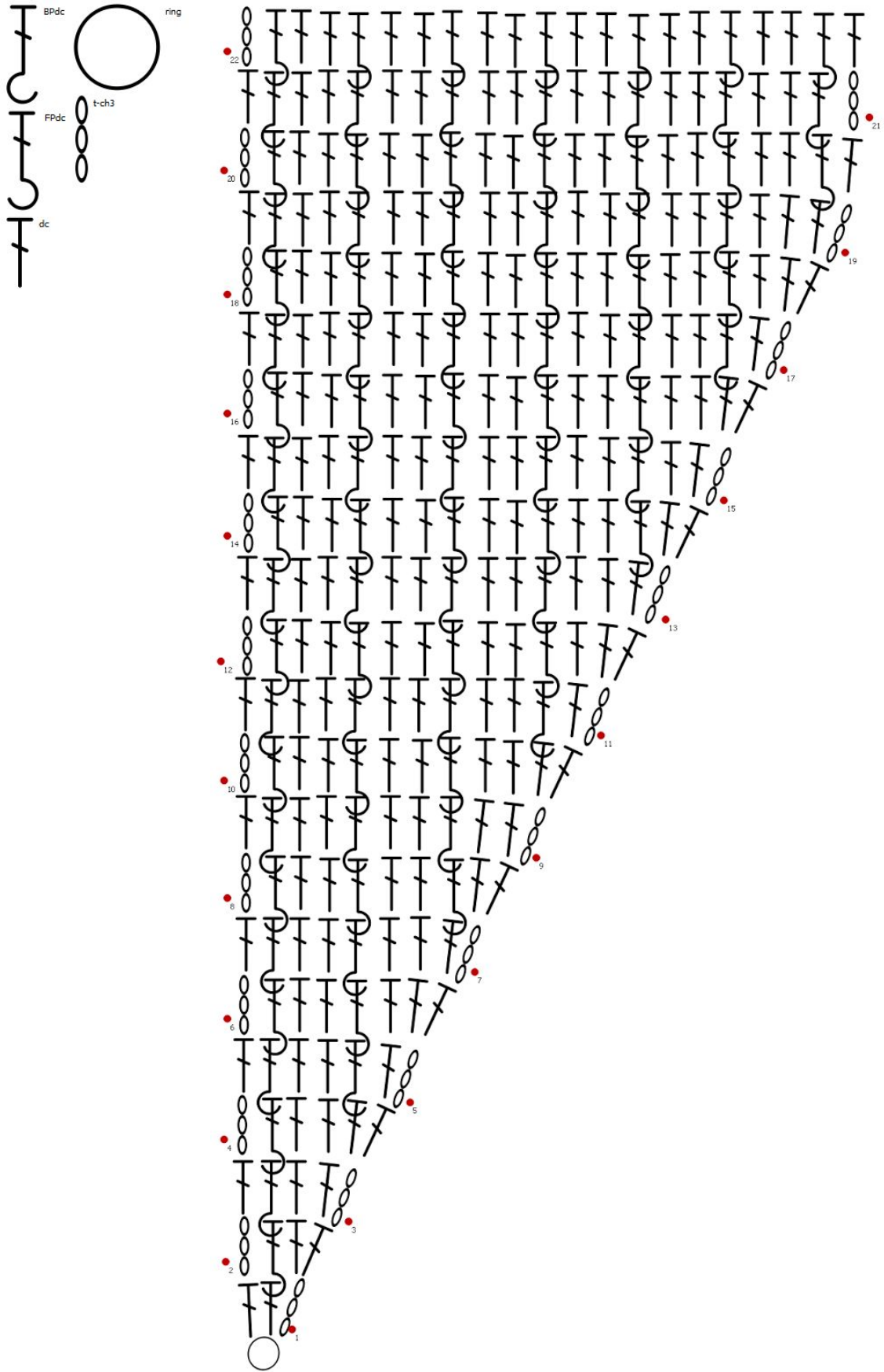
